The next Emotionally Healthy Spirituality Course starts on Sunday 2nd February

from 6 - 8 p.m. at The Cornerstone Centre. Drawing from 8 core biblical truths the goal is to introduce a life with God that goes beyond "tip of the iceberg" spirituality, teaching us to slow down and grow a deep relationship with Jesus.

It will explore areas that may be hard or painful, so it will require a certain level of openness and vulnerability, especially in small group discussions. Along with committing to each 2-hour session, there is weekly and daily reading, so we encourage you to carefully consider whether this is the right fit for you at this time. That being said, if you're able to dedicate the time, you will find it incredibly rewarding and won't be disappointed.
