For veterans of this event, we are walking the other way around this year – starting with the Three Hills climb and ending with the Warren/Harbour Arm/Leas walk in.

Jack's Rake – Friday 28th – Sunday 30th June.



There is an amazing opportunity to travel to the Lake District and climb Jack's Rake, a spine-tingling cliff walk, described by one of last year's walkers as 'the best day of 2023.'

Jack's Rake is the ascent of Pavey Arc at Langdale, Lake District. The climb is 700m (2300ft) and includes a scramble. Walkers need to be able to handle heights and hard walking. At the top there are 4 other 'Wainwrights' which we can climb if we wish.

John Fudge will be travelling up in a car with 5 spaces, on Friday 28th June, returning Sunday 30th June. The event includes 2 nights with Simon and Pauline Kaye (veterans of the 3 Yorkshire peaks walks will know that their hospitality is incredible). The accommodation will in dorms (bring a sleeping bag) with all food and drink supplied from Friday night to Sunday lunch. The walk will be guided by Paul Little, and old friend and qualified mountain leader.

The event costs £75.00 and is sure to be a wonderful adventure with some excellent people. The actual climb is of course weather dependent, and if conditions are unsafe, we will take an alternative beautiful walk. Travel will be free as john is driving up in any case.
